Trustee Fields: What is Early Head Start?

Principal Atchison: The only difference between Early Head Start and regular Head Start is there age. You are doing basically the same things but the students are younger.

Principal Atchison: Head Start has 16 in a classroom and Early Head Start has eight. There are still two teachers. The interest is high. We will have the classroom full in no time. It's great for YCS because we can start them off early.

Presentation: A. Special Education Millage Presentation

A 2.3826 mil renewal to cover unreimbursed costs to provide special education services in Washtenaw County.

The millage renewal would continue to benefit all public school students because revenue from the millage would continue to cover most of the costs of mandatory special education services. The millage renewal would preserve each school district's general fund budget, which can be used for the educational needs of all students. Local districts would decide how best to use these funds.

Millage dollars stay local. Revenue from this renewal would be used to pay for services mandated for special education in: Ann Arbor, Chelsea, Dexter, Lincoln, Manchester, Milan, Saline, Whitmore Lake, Ypsilanti, and Washtenaw County's 13 public school academies.

Action: A. Michigan - Alternate Route to Certification Agreement

Michigan- Alternate Route to Certification (M-ARC) is a program through the University of Michigan. The initial certification pathway is an avenue into the teaching profession for candidates who hold a bachelor's degree. Candidates in this pathway work as certified teachers (with salary and benefits) for 3 years while enrolled in the program. Our SEEK grant pays their program fees as a strategy to retain these talented educators.

Trustee Townsend: This is separate from what we have with the WISD and Eastern?

Dr. Coscarella: This is U of M and it is for people who have already earned a bachlors degree and are seeking a way to certification. So for the next three years they are employed by YCS while they get their certification and they have a commitment to YCS through 2029-30 in return we pay for their fees.

Trustee Gainsley: I would like a little more background, and it talks about an 8-week timeline and I am wondering when that would start.

Dr. Zachery-Ross: I have asked one of the consultants, Dr. Narcisse, to be on the call. We looked at a number of other proposals, some went for two years, and other longer programs, but we wanted this specific group of board members to have a big part of the work. We want to do some implementing with our partnership work we are doing with the state of Michigan since this is totally connected with MCIP. We want to hear from our community.

Dr. Narcisse: Thank you for letting us work with you on your strategic plan. Getting the voices of everyone involved. As far as the eight weeks is concerned, the first thing we do is gather a lot of information from a lot of different people and then we create pillars that the board and the community decide are the most important components so we can create measurements to get there.

Trustee Townsend: How are the community stakeholders going to be selected?

Dr. Narcisse: We have a discussion with the board and superintendent about who they would like to include. Also including internal staff. You would need to let us know what community members you want to include, faith-base, etc. We talk to non-profits as well so we are gathering anyone who supports the school system.

Trustee Townsend: You issue surveys?

Dr. Narcisse: The district I showed for an example wanted to use surveys to see how they were doing. To gather information, we like to do on the ground focus groups.

Trustee Gainsley: It seems we would start quite soon and try to wrap up by the end of the year.

Dr. Narcisse: Yes, if you say yes tonight we are ready to start meeting right away, board members individually and then as a group as well as the superintendent. We would love to have a designated retreat where we have you all as well as the superintendent and the executive cabinet in a room together to all get on the same page and lay the process out.

Dr. Hawkins: Is there a period of follow up or monitoring after the process that you provide?

Dr. Narcisse: We do a quarterly monitoring to look at your key performance indicators to make sure there is clarity and alignment in terms of process.

Dr. Hawkins: Quarterly for how long?

Dr. Narcisse: For a year, but if you want the monitoring for longer thy are all additions we can talk about it.
